



Introducing “Deuce” & “Thunder” The Two Newest Cars In The Competitive Edge Fleet

Following a tradition in motorsports, the Competitive Edge Racing School gives every race car in their fleet a “nickname”. Over the offseason the crew at Competitive Edge has been hard at work, building three new race cars to add to their existing fleet, providing you the opportunity to drive and race one of eight, NASCAR-style late models.

Each car’s nickname has been given to the car by the crew and the latest two additions are “Deuce” and “Thunder.” These two new cars will join Dreamer, Bullet, Tennessee, Rocket, and McPita for the 2011 season.

As each car takes shape it also takes on a personality which leads to the cars name. Deuce received it’s name for two reason’s. This chassis was resurrected from an earlier car in the fleet, giving her a second life. The chassis was completely redesigned by Randy Koch, lead instructor at the Competitive Edge Racing School and is the prototype for the new “Edge Chassis” manufactured by Competitive Edge. Deuce also carried the number 2 on her door at one time, leading to her nick name.

Thunder is the first “Edge Chassis” completely built in-house by the Competitive Edge team. While Thunder’s name may have to do more with her future sponsor to be announced soon, it may also have to do with all of the noise that she is making in the racing world about the innovative design of her new chassis.

The crew plans to complete one more new car prior to the season opener in May as well as a full service on all of the cars in the Competitive Edge fleet, which entails tearing each car down and completely re-assembling it from the ground up. This ensures that the best possible race cars are being driven by all of the customers that take to the track.

“When we decided to build these new cars,” explained Randy Koch, “We wanted to design and build a car that would not only meet our needs for the school, but would also be a competitive race car in any late model class across the country. That is why the new Edge Chassis was created.”

The schools newest race cars will also get the chance to prove that they are competitive on the track. Competitive Edge has plans to enter these new cars at State Line Speedway in the local Inland Championship Auto Racing (ICAR) series this summer. Cars will also be available to rent for the ICAR races.
